<u>Difference Between</u> <u>a Team and Group</u>

<u>Team</u>

2 or more people who interact on a common activity Individual commitment to the welfare of the group High level of trust among members of team 98% of teams will out perform the best member on learningrelated tasks*


<u>Group</u>

- 2 or more people who interact on a common activity
- Individual commitment to group is casual, temporary or permanent



*<u>Team Based Learning</u>

Small groups of students interact as in-class teams to apply content to simple and complex problems with the feedback of the instructor as the content expert.

- Problem solving,
- critical thinking,
- interpersonal communication skills in the classroom

- More fun for everyone!






